Topics being taught this term:

Our topic this half term is 'This is us'. After the half term holiday we will be learning about 'Festivals and Celebrations'. If your child has any books, pictures or photographs of themselves, families and celebrations please can they bring there in to show the class, as we would all love to see them and learn more from each other. To avoid any disappointment or upset please leave all toys at home.

There will be time in each class for 'Show and Tell' on Fridays, so if you have made or created anything exciting at home, we would love to see it! This could be anything from writing and drawings produced at home, postcards from holidays, or photos of places they have been to.

How you can help your child at home

We value the support you can give to your child at home. It really does make a big difference.

Self-care: We would like parents to encourage their children to be able to go to the toilet independently and remind them about good hygiene.

Dressing and undressing: Can we please ask parents to support their child with dressing and undressing independently. Also teach them to put on their coats and do up their zips independently too. Please provide your child with velcro straps on shoes and not laces, as laces can a be a tripping hazard and children are unable to tie up their laces by themselves.



Lunch times: We are encouraging children to eat a variety of healthy foods independently, using knives, forks and spoons. Please support your child with the use of these at home as well.

Reading: Your child will bring their reading books home after the half term. Please ensure that your child's reading record and reading books are kept in their book bag so they are returned to school every day, as we read with your child regularly in class. Please try to hear your child read for short sessions as often as possible. It is important for you to re-read familiar books as well as new ones.

Writing: In Reception we introduce children to pre-cursive handwriting. Please encourage your child to form pre-cursive letters when practising handwriting with them at home.

Sounds: Every week your child will be learning new sounds. These will be sent home in their reading folder. Please try to ensure your child practises the letter sounds on a daily basis.

Maths: We are focusing on numbers 1-20 this term. We would like parents to support their children with counting up to 20 objects accurately and also being able to recognise and form the numerals correctly. In Shape Space and Measure children with be focusing on recognising the names and properties of 2D shapes such as; oval, circle equire, rectangle, triangle, hexagon and a pentagon. They will also begin to use language related to size. For example; big, small and medium size and ordering different objects in size order.

P.E.

P.E takes place every Tuesday.

- Please make sure your child has a P.E. bag containing the following in school:
 - ~ White t-shirt
 - ~ Navy or black shorts/ jogging bottoms (for the winter months)
 - ~ Black plimsolls

Please clearly label anything your child brings or wears into school with their name and class. This includes their coat which should be brought into school daily due to the changeable weather.
