We value the religious background of all members of the school community and hope that this will encourage individuals to share their own experiences with others freely. All religions and their communities are treated with respect and sensitivity and we value the links, which are, and can be made between home, school, and a faith community.</p> <p>Religious Education lessons does not seek to endorse religious beliefs on children or to compromise the integrity of their own beliefs by promoting one religion over another.</p>	<p>Through their Religious Education learning, children at Lake Farm Park Academy are able to make links between their own lives and those of others in their community and in the wider world. They are able to draw links between their knowledge and places of worship they have visited as part of their curriculum. Children are developing an understanding of other people’s cultures and ways of life, which they are then able to communicate to the wider community. Religious Education offers our children the means by which to understand how other people choose to live and to understand why they choose to live in that way.</p> <p>Our children will have a confident set of skills, knowledge and norms such as respect, resilience, tolerance and appreciation, which are in line with British values and also in line with our school values. They can then use these skills to get ahead in education and life more generally. In short they will learn more, remember more, enjoy more and develop more spiritually, socially and emotionally. Hence enabling them to be equipped for their next stage in education and life beyond school.</p>
