# How did the Vikings change Britain?





#### What will we be learning?

We will be learning about who the Vikings were and where they originated from. We will look at the timeline preceding the first Viking invasion (which happened around AD787) and the repeated power struggles as the Vikings sailed the seas, raiding and taking over land.

- \*The Vikings (also known as Norsemen) came from three countries of Scandinavia
- \*The name 'Viking' means 'a pirate raid'.
- \*Vikings sailed the seas, raiding and taking over land.
- \*The Vikings were Pagans and raided many monasteries.

#### Glossary

Vikings- people from Scandinavia:

Denmark, Sweden and Norway.

Conquer- to get something by force.

Treaty- A written agreement between two states.

Raid- a surprise attack.

Danegeld- Land tax to raise funds for protection against Vikings.

Viking longship- A ship used by Vikings for raids.

Settlement- A place where people have come to live.

**Monastery**- a place where people devote their time to God. (The Vikings were Pagans and raided many monasteries).

**Danelaw-** The area in Britain that the Vikings ruled.

- \*King Aethelred II introduced the agreement Danegeld.
- \*King Cnut king of England
- \*William the Conqueror
