

# **Year 5 Spring 1 Curriculum Map**

# 'Learning, Achieving, Aspiring Together'

As part of our cross-curricular learning this half-term, children will explore and answer their Main Driver Question (MDQ) - 'What part did the Tudors play in the reformation of Britain?' This will be taught, not just through Geography and History, but intertwined through all subjects within our curriculum, and in your child's research homework. We will also be visiting Hampton Court Palace, on 26th January, home to King Henry VIII.

### Reading: Treason by Berlie Doherty

Treason is an historical novel set in the Tudor period. It deals with the intrigue, ambitions and fears in Henry VIII's court, seen through the eyes of 11 year old Will Montague.

We learn how to effectively discern the most important ideas in a text, how to ignore irrelevant information, and how to integrate the central ideas in a meaningful way, thus developing our summarising reading skill. Children should be reading for a minimum of 45 minutes a day, at home, in order to progress in learning.



### Writing

This half-term, children will step into the role of the main character from Treason (Will). We write diary entries about what life is like as King Henry's page boy. After this, children will use their research skills to write a balanced argument - Was King Henry a good king? This provides opportunity to develop speaking and listening skills as we learn to debate clearly with confidence.

## **PSHE**

In PSHE, our topic is 'Relationships'. We will look at self-recognition, building self-esteem, safer online communities and reducing screen time.



## Science

Our MDQ is 'How does the property of a material affect its purpose?'

Our Enquiry Questions (EQ) include:

- How can we compare and group materials?
- Is a solid always hard?
- Is a liquid always runny?
- Are all metals the same?
- Are all plastics the same?



# **Computing**

This half term our unit is based on Computer Science (CS). We will explore programming through physical computing.

# History

We will be exploring the MDQ-'What part did the Tudors play in the reformation of Britain?'. Some of our learning includes understanding who the Tudors were, the War of Roses, explore similarities and differences between crimes and punishments. We will also explore the changes in political and religious landscape of Britain.

Maths
Children will be starting
with 'Multiplication and Division', then
progressing onto 'Fractions'. In Year 5,
we focus on numbers up to one million,
including decimal numbers. Children
should be able to easily convert
between fractions, decimals and
percentages and then, apply these skills
to complete multi-step word problems.

# **Religious Education**



Our MDQ for this half term is 'How can Brahman be in everything?' We will explore forgiveness and betrayal.

# <u>Art</u>

Children will be observing, sketching, designing and creating portraits of King Henry VIII. We will also explore the concept of perspective and compare and develop ideas through feedback and evaluation.

## Geography

We will also cover Geography, building on children's knowledge of landscape changes in Britain.

# **Physical Education**

This half-term our unit is 'Dance'. We will perform clear shapes and build patterns as part of a team. Then, copy and execute a high energy jump sequence, creating a low level attack sequence.

## Music

Children will study Gustav Holst's work 'The Planets'. We will explore pitch, tempo, duration dynamics to recreate a performance based on 'The Planets'.



# <u>Languages – French</u>

Our topic is 'My Family and Me.'
We will learn conversational language to be able to talk about families, recap pronouns and an introduction of negative form.
